SKETCH OF MUSICAL SERVICE RENDERED BY MISS LILIAS JANNEY
LEESBURG PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH AND THE COMMUNITY OF
LOUDOUN COUNTY

Miss Liliias Janney who has been honored with a life membership in the Women of the Leesburg Presbyterian Church, has lived a life dedicated to Christian Service and to music. Miss Janney's father, Charles P. Janney, was ruling elder and a moving spirit in the Sunday School of the church for many years. Her mother taught ~~the~~ piano in Leesburg before her marriage.

At the age of twelve, Miss Janney studied under Waldeker in Washington. She was educated in the Powell school in Richmond, and studied music there under Professor Hahr. Then later studied in Dresden, Germany and after this under Madame Von Unschuld, of the Washington University of Music.

Miss Janney was instrumental in securing the two very fine pipe organs that have blessed the old Presbyterian Church in Leesburg. The last organ placed in the church in memory of her nephew Robert Stevenson Janney, who gave his life in the World War in 1944.

Miss Janney organized the first choral club of Loudoun County Virginia, and was the accompaniment for the school music for six years.

Her work as organist in the church has been of a high order and uninterrupted for over forty years. We feel thankful for this beautiful service she is rendering so faithfully.
