Social-Emotional Development

Self-Expression

- Tells name and age
- Identifies favorite things
- Demonstrates self-confidence
- Able to lead and follow peers

Interactions with Others

- Separates easily from parents
- Behaves cooperatively
- Shares & takes turns
- Shows concern for others
- Expresses affection appropriately
- Shows self-control when angry or upset
- Uses words to express needs and/or wants

Language Development

Receptive

- Follows one- or two- step directions
- Shows a longer attention span when listening
- Listens to others at circle time

Expressive

- Speech is understandable
- Can say own name, age and gender
- Can tell about object when asked

Conversational

- Alternates between listening and speaking
- Waits for his/her turn to speak in a group

Cognitive Development

- Sorts objects into 3 or more categories
- Recognizes written name
- Identifies some letters of the alphabet, particularly the letters in his/her name
- Identifies numbers 0-10
- Counts orally to 20
- One-to-one correspondence counting to 10
- Names the 8 basic colors
- Identifies regular shapes: triangle, square, circle, rectangle, star, diamond
- Recognizes and repeats simple patterns
- Predicts cause and effect relationships
- Tells about past and future events

Physical Development

- Builds block tower of 9 or more
- Hops on one foot
- Kicks a ball
- Catches a bounced ball
- Throws a ball forward
- Walks up and down stairs with alternating feet
- Turns pages of book
- Uses correct grasp when holding pencil (after instruction)
- Copies name
- Draws and copies shapes
- Uses scissors correctly
- Draws a person

Music

- Participates in songs and finger plays
- Repeats rhythmic patterns

****Parents:** It is important to remember all children develop at a different rate in the various areas.

Where one child may excel in language, he/she may be average in cognitive or physical skills.

These skills were designed for two, three and four year-olds, so please don't be concerned if your child has not mastered every task. We have a long year ahead of us for the four year-olds, and years to go for the younger ones!
